## Welcome to the Mary Mack Warner Dog Park at Anne Springs Close Greenway

### Waiver

- By using the Dog Park, you agree that you understand and assume all responsibility and liability for the risks of unleashing your dog(s) in the Dog Park and of being in the presence of other unleashed dogs in the Dog Park.
- The Dog Park is an unsupervised facility that requires users to abide by its rules and always properly supervise their dogs while on the premises.
- Entry to the Dog Park is only open to Dog Park members. Members use the Dog Park entirely at their own risk and that of their dog(s). By entering the Dog Park, you agree to indemnify Anne Springs Close Greenway and Leroy Springs & Company, Inc. for any liability or damages related to the actions or negligence of you or your dog while in or around the Dog Park.

### Membership

- Membership to the Mary Warner Mack Dog Park (Dog Park) is open to Anne Springs Close Greenway (the Greenway) members who purchase an additional Dog Park membership.
- Only dogs registered with the Dog Park through the Greenway are allowed in the Dog Park.
- Dog Park membership identification is required upon entry to the Greenway when visiting the Dog Park.
- Guests are not allowed within the Dog Park.
- **Children ages 12 and under are not permitted** inside the Dog Park; children ages 13-15 must be accompanied by an adult.

### Operating Schedule/Gate Access

- The Dog Park operates on the same schedule as the Greenway. Entry to the Dog Park is not permitted at any time that the main gates to the Greenway are closed. The Dog Park is closed each Tuesday until 1:00pm for scheduled landscape and facility maintenance. Dog Park trails may be closed due to weather, which may differ from the larger Greenway trail status. **For the status of the Dog Park trails or Dog Park closings, call 803.547.1019.**
- Dog Park members must enter a four-digit gate code provided by the Greenway to access the Dog Park. This number should not be shared with others and the gate should not be held open for others who may or may not be members to enter.

## Dog Park Rules and Regulations

Users who fail to abide by the following rules and regulations are subject to loss of Dog Park privileges which may result in the cancelation of membership without refund. Members are solely responsible for any injury or damage caused by their dog(s). **Dogs should never be left unattended.**

- **All dogs must be spayed or neutered and registered on your Dog Park membership. Proof of current vaccinations is required for each dog.** Vaccinations required include Rabies, Bordetella, Distemper and Parvo (may be abbreviated as DAPP, DA2PPC, DA2pp, DHPP, DHPPV, DHLPP).
- Dogs under four months old and sick dogs are not allowed in the Dog Park.
- **Each member may bring a maximum of two registered dogs to the Dog Park per visit.** Each member household may register up to four dogs for Dog Park admission.
- **Users are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs in all areas of the Dog Park, including along the trails,** and disposing of waste in the containers provided.
- **Leashes must be removed from dogs upon entry through the Dog Park gate.**
- Users must carry a leash and always remain inside the fenced area of the Dog Park within view and voice control of their dog(s). If it becomes necessary to leash a dog while in the Dog Park, please exit the Dog Park promptly.
- **Dogs with a history of biting or aggressive behavior are not allowed.** The Greenway has the right, in its sole discretion, to deny Dog Park entry to any dog that a Greenway staff member has determined to be aggressive or a danger to other dogs or Dog Park members. Dogs exhibiting aggressive or uncontrollable behavior must be leashed and removed from the Dog Park immediately by their owners.
- **Food, treats or bones are not allowed inside the Dog Park.** Toys are allowed at the user's own risk and must be removed from the Dog Park upon leaving. No glass containers or products are allowed.
- Members are required to stop their dogs from digging in the Dog Park and to fill any holes created by their dogs.
- **Dogs must always remain on a leash while outside of the designated Dog Park areas.** No choke or prong collars are allowed.
- Members should not approach or pet any dog not belonging to them without the owner's permission.
- No wheeled vehicles, including strollers, are allowed, except wheelchairs used by people with physical challenges.
- Outside alcohol, smoking and the use of any other tobacco products are prohibited in the Dog Park and throughout the Greenway.

**If your dog bites or inflicts an injury to another dog while in the Dog Park, provide your name and telephone number to the other dog's owner before leaving and contact the Greenway at 803.547.4575.**

**Immediately report ALL dog bites on a human by contacting the SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) office at 803.909.7379 or York County Animal Control at 803.628.3190. If the bite occurs after hours or on the weekend, call the York County Emergency Services number at 803.329.1110. IN CASE OF EMERGENCY, CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY.**

## Other Important Information about the Mary Mack Warner Dog Park

- The Dog Park is comprised of three separate fenced areas: a small dog park (for dogs under 30 pounds), a large dog park (for dogs over 30 pounds), and an off-leash trail area for all dogs. The off-leash trail area is partially bordered by Lake Frances. The lake serves as a border to the off-leash trail area but is not fenced on the far side. Some dogs may be able to swim across the lake and be outside of the fenced area. For the safety of your dog, please ensure your dog responds properly to voice commands before allowing your dog to swim.
- **The Dog Park's main entry and exit gate is located near the parking area. Access the unleashing area of the gate by entering the provided gate code on the keypad.** New codes are issued periodically by the Greenway and sent to members by email.
- Keep dogs leashed until inside the unleashing area and allow other members to exit the unleashing area before entering.
- **Please close the gate securely behind you and do not hold the gate open for other members or nonmembers.** Unleash your dog and observe the behavior of the other nearby dogs in the Dog Park. If the behavior of your dog and the dogs in the Dog Park is friendly, open the gate to enter the Dog Park and securely close it behind you.
- The off-leash trails of the Dog Park range in difficulty from easy to moderately strenuous and lead downhill to Lake Frances. There are possible ways that your dog could escape the Dog Park, including going through, around and under the perimeter fence or across the lake. Owners should always keep their dog(s) in view and under voice command to prevent this from happening.
- There are multiple locked service entrances to provide access for maintenance and emergency personnel to the Dog Park. Please do not enter or exit through these gates. If you notice that a service gate is unlocked or unsecured, please call the Greenway at 803.547.4575 or contact the welcome station attendant at the Adventure Road Entrance to the Greenway.

**If you have trouble entering the Dog Park, call the Greenway at 803.547.4575 or contact the welcome station attendant at the Greenway's Adventure Road Entrance. For Dog Park status, call 803.547.1019.**

*The Greenway has the authority to close the Dog Park for any reason, including maintenance, weather-related problems, protection of natural habitat, and for special events as needed without extension or refund. The Greenway and Leroy Springs & Company, Inc. have the right to modify Dog Park rules and regulations as necessary to ensure the safety of users and the effective operation and maintenance of the Dog Park.*
